Kaipara Enjoys Success at MUNA 2015

'Jaw War - not War War!' was the catch-phrase for those that attended this year's annual Model United Nations Assembly last month. Kaipara College delegates Emma Gordon, Khendra Harvey and Emily Dainty donned the mantle of Chilean diplomats and joined representatives from 50 other North Island schools to make up the Assembly of 98 countries. Over two days, the students lobbied vigorously and spoke on a range of remits. Emily presented a strong case for policy changes to reduce the world drug trade. Emma contributed to an impromptu debate on biodiversity, pointing out the link between poverty and environmental degradation. Chile is currently on the Security Council which enabled the girls to hone their public speaking and debating skills. At the end of two highly stimulating days, the girls found themselves on the podium to receive the 2015 prize for the most valuable contribution to the Security Council. This was a first for Kaipara. 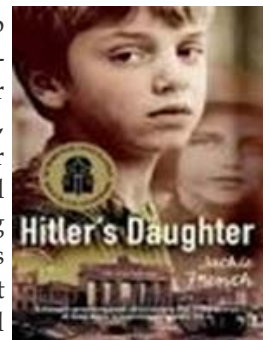
