YEAR 11 HISTORY BAY OF ISLANDS TRIP

Members of the Year 11 History class travelled north to visit some of New Zealand's significant historic sites and to learn about their history.

Places visited included the world famous Hundertwasser toilets in Kawakawa, Kemp House and the Stone Store in Kerikeri, Waitangi and Okiato (New Zealand's first national capital). The bullet holes at Christ Church were then examined followed by a visit to the Ohaewai and Ruapekapeka battlefields and the Waimate North Mission Station.

It was a terrific couple of days where the students could see places of significant New Zealand historical importance.




GOLF

Kaipara College took an 8 strong team to the North Island Skiing championships. The team comprised of Brianna Clarke, Samuel Coldicutt, Zoe Cook, Max Lusty, Jacinta Page, Nathan Perkovic, Rosie Smith and Sam Teuruaa.

They had great weather early in the week which set the scene for the quality of skiing they saw.

This year there were 128 teams entered and we had our first team place 66th in the Giant Slalom and second

team 108th. Our top Junior Girl, Rosie Smith placed 36th with a time of 31.41 out of 177 competitors (winning time was 25.72). Our top Junior Boy, Sam Teuruaa placed 175th with a time of 39.16 (winning time 21.36). Our top Senior, Nathan Perkovic placed 68th with a time of 49.13 (winning time 28.57). Both teams competed well in the Dual Slalom with Rosie, Brianna and Sam T beating their opponents. Rosie, Jacinta and all the boys had a bit of fun on the Slope Style course showing us some spectacular jumps and crashes! We were not quite up to the standard of the winning Kristin Team who were outstanding with their back flips and triple twists in the air.
