The Hall and the Admin block with its associated classrooms is now sealed tight and a scaffold supported tent rises over the roof to facilitate its removal the moment school finishes for the year. Some gardens immediately around the block will be dug out and the soil replaced.

The school is working with the Ministry of Education to get the remedial work done as soon as possible. Over the holidays not only will the roof be replaced but all the soft furnishings, carpets and notice boards stripped out of the block and replaced. By the time the New Year begins the College should have a newly refurbished Admin area.

I would like to acknowledge the support of the Ministry in ensuring that the environmental tests, the sealing of the block and roof was carried out in time for us to begin school again this week. This was particularly important for the senior students whose NCEA exams began on Monday.
