Building Update

The contractors and the Ministry have been working this week to complete the wrapping of the roof and to undertake a more detailed survey of the extent of the asbestos dust contamination through the block.

There has been constant air monitoring in the block and around the fence on the perimeter of the block. All these air monitoring samples are negative for asbestos fibres.

The Ministry is also collating all the expert recommendations about decontamination and remedial work aside from just replacing the roof.

We expect to know the extent of this work early next week. The remedial work will begin just after New Year.
