Geographers go Walk About

Day One: Our first stop was a walk in Karangahake Gorge to get a sense of the conditions the early gold miners worked in. The *Windows Walk* incorporated a lot of tunnel and some spectacular views. Then it was on to Waihi to see the different approach to mining today in the open cast Martha Mine. We learned that the gold extraction in the mine will probably be exhausted within the next two years. A four kilometre walk circumnavigating the pit rim was welcome before the marathon drive to Whakatane - our base for the next two days.



Day Two: We had an easy 50km boat trip, out to White Island (Whakaari) where students were required to don hard hats and gas masks before a tour of the island, where they got see its unique landscape complete with fumaroles, ash covering and volcanic bombs from the most recent eruption, plus a steaming crater lake. We also got to meet Dino the Dinosaur of global fame and have our photo taken by one of the GNS cameras monitoring the volcanic activity. Exploration of the mining relics was brief but provided great photo opportunities. Our trip home was accompanied by some seal and shark sightings as well as some great story-telling thanks to interesting and informed crew members and passengers.

Day Three: Whakatane Council Chambers was our first port of call for the day, where we were given the royal treatment and an informative presentation on the local Civil Defence strategies for dealing with a Tsunami. For the students it also provided an opportunity to see where a degree in Geography could lead them. With the serious matters of the day behind us, it was time to take on the Luge in Rotorua before facing the perils of peak hour motorway traffic in Auckland.
